





## STATEMENT OF FAITH

*I believe* in the one Triune God of heaven and earth: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We are created in God's own image, and in life and in death we belong to God. God is all-powerful, all-knowing, ever-present, and all-loving. God is revealed to us through Scripture and in our world, but we can by no means describe God's glory completely.

*I believe* that God created us for an intimate relationship with Godself. Though we try, we are powerless to overcome the effects of sin. Yet, in ultimate love for the world, God the Father sent to us Jesus Christ to save the world.

*I believe* that Jesus entered into our existence, conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. Jesus is fully human and fully divine. It is only through Jesus that we can reclaim a true relationship with God. Our forgiveness is offered through Christ's blood, where we are made clean and freed from the dominion of sin. *I believe* in one Holy Universal Church. Although we are divided into denominations with different governmental forms and creeds, all followers of Christ are part of the Body of Christ. As a member of the reformed faith,

I believe that the church is reformed and always reforming through the power of the Holy Spirit. I uphold two Sacraments, the Lord's Supper and Baptism, that God has given us as outward signs of an inward grace. At the communion table, we join with believers across time and space in celebrating the sacrifice of our Lord Jesus. We proclaim His life, death, and resurrection until He returns to us.
